Forthcoming Concerts

Thanks to those who signed up for the RNLI concert on **20th June 2009**. This was the most supported so we have agreed a concert then. The concert will take place at **Walton Village Hall at 7.00 pm**. Rehearsals will start on Tuesday 19th May at College Grove, and will continue weekly up to the concert, so please put these dates in your diary! It is essential that our public

performances are well prepared and only regular rehearsal can ensure that. If you missed the notice and would like to take part, let Ernie Lowe know as soon as possible. We have also been asked to perform for **South Milford W. I. on 15th October 2009**. We need volunteers, so if you are interested again let Ernie know. It is likely that we will be asked to do a shorter concert at a local

Masonic Lodge's Ladies' night in June, but the exact date is not yet known. There is a possibility that we may be asked to repeat this in December. We only accept requests for concerts once we are sure that there are sufficient chorus members available in each voice part, so if you have volunteered, or do so in the future, please do your very best to treat it as a firm commitment!

Your committee are considering concerts which are “cut-down” versions of full G&S operas. These would be similar to those performed at Grims Dyke (for those who have been!).

Simply put, Principal parts would be performed in costume as a full show with movement tailored to fit a smaller performing area. The chorus would perform as a backing choir, probably not in costume, and could use scores if necessary.

Trial by Jury, Pirates, The Mikado, and Pinafore lend themselves to this format

and offer shows of varying length. They would, need some initial rehearsal and a “pool” of principals would be required.

There are suitable venues around West Yorkshire that could be used, and one suggestion is that the society could hire these and sell tickets as for any other performance.

The benefit would be that it should be easier to fill these venues for one-off concerts and that it would introduce our work to local people who might then support our main show.

At the same time we would not be averse to letting some other organisation take the risk and keep any profit after paying us a fee!

When, or is it if, the Theatre Royal closes for a season for refurbishment then we could be ready to “go on tour” with all or any of the operas mentioned.

If there are any more members/patrons/friends who would like to come please feel free, but do let us know in advance. We are hoping to provide some sort of supper so it is imperative that we have a good idea of numbers. The format hasn’t yet been finalized but we are considering a quiz (general

knowledge) and some sort of sing-a-long. The best supported item on your “wish-list” was a **theatre visit**, which 32 of you showed interest in. We are attempting to arrange a trip to see “Seven brides for seven brothers” at **Leeds Grand on 30th June**. Show tickets are £25 to £30 each depending on numbers. Some of you have asked if a coach can be arranged and this would be an additional cost of £8 per head. If 20 or more people wanted to go by coach we would need a larger vehicle and the cost would go up to between £10 and £16 per head depending on the actual numbers. A final booking list will be available at rehearsals, but if you are not on the list and want to be included please contact Kath Lowe as before. The other two events that were well supported were a barbecue and an evening walk. We will be trying to organize these during the summer.
